Textile machinery and accessories — Flat warp knitting machines — Numbering of guide bars

1 Scope

This International Standard specifies the designation and the numbering of guide bars for flat warp knitting machines.

NOTE The figures in this International Standard are given as examples. They do not represent the only, or even the most common arrangement.

3 Terms and definitions

For the purposes of this document, the terms and definitions given in ISO 8640-1 apply.

4 Designation and abbreviation of guide bars

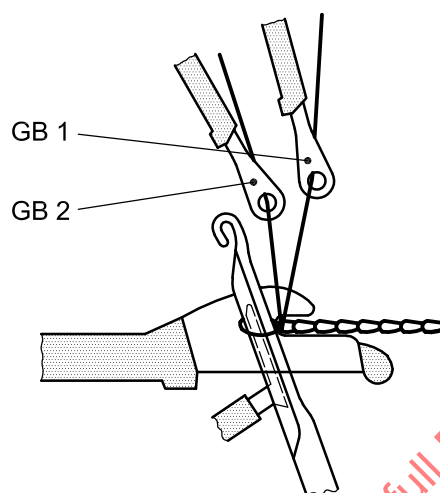


Figure 1 — RL (single) tricot machine with 2 ground guide bars (GB 1, GB 2)

The numbering of guide bars — general abbreviation: B — is done from front to back and from bottom to top using continuous Arabic figures 1 to *n*.

5 Numbering of guide bars

5.1 RL (single) flat warp knitting machine

5.1.1 RL (single) tricot machine

Guide bar 1 (B 1) is the foremost positioned bar with yarn guides or yarn guide units (see Figure 1).

5.1.2 RL (single) Raschel machine

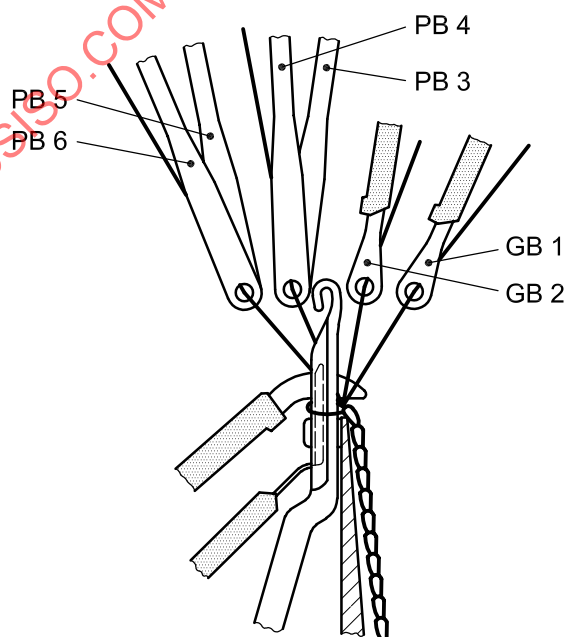


Figure 2 — RL (single) Raschel machine with 6 guide bars, of these 2 ground (GB 1, GB 2) and 4 pattern guide bars (PB 3 to PB 6)

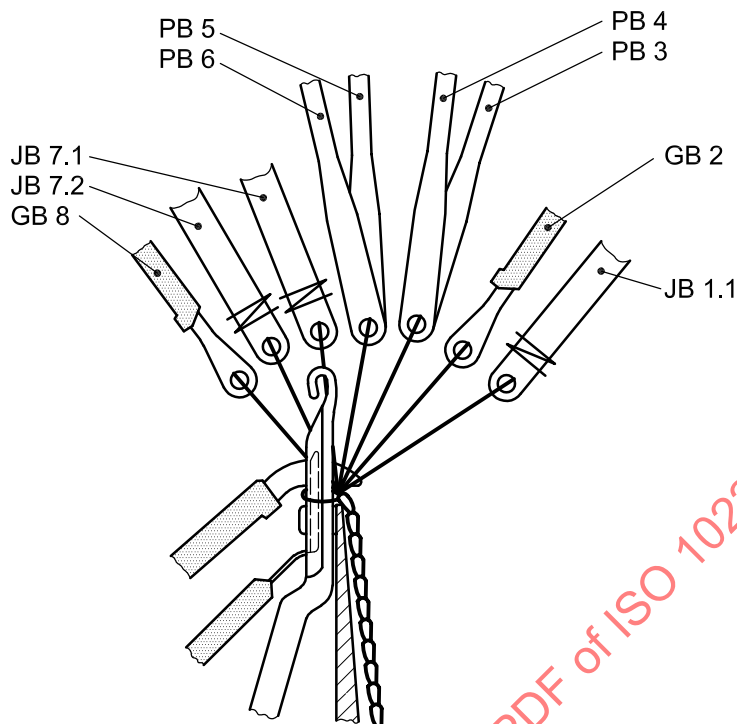


Figure 3 — (single) Raschel machine with 8 guide bars, of these 2 ground guide bars (GB 2, GB 8), 4 pattern guide bars (PB 3 to PB 6), 1 Jacquard split guide bar with half gauge (JB 1.1) and 1 Jacquard guide bar consisting of 2 Jacquard split guide bars each with half gauge (JB 7.1, JB 7.2)

Guide bar 1 (B 1) is the foremost positioned bar with yarn guides or yarn guide units (see Figures 2 and 3).

5.1.3 RL (single) crochet machine

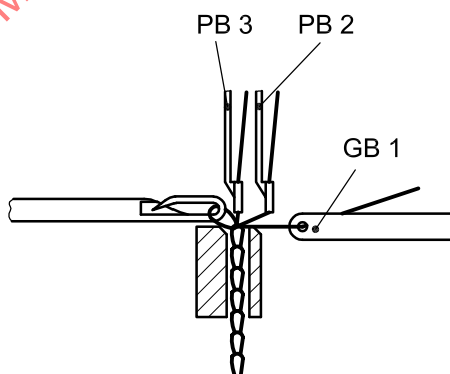


Figure 4 — RL (single) crochet machine with 3 guide bars, of these 1 ground (GB 1) and 2 pattern guide bars (PB 2, PB 3)

Guide bar 1 (B 1) is the foremost and lowest positioned bar with yarn guides or yarn guide units (see Figure 4).

5.1.4 RL (single) stitch bonding machine

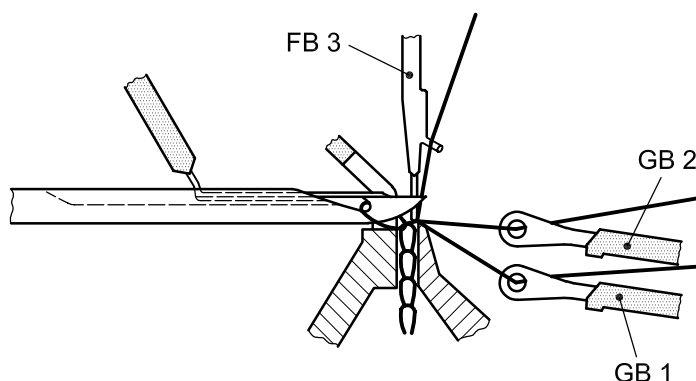


Figure 5 — RL (single) stitch bonding machine with 3 guide bars, of these 2 ground (GB 1, GB 2) and 1 filler thread guide bar (FB 3)

Guide bar 1 (B 1) is the foremost and lowest positioned bar with yarn guides or yarn guide units (see Figure 5).

5.2 RR (double) flat warp knitting machine

5.2.1 RR (double) tricot machine

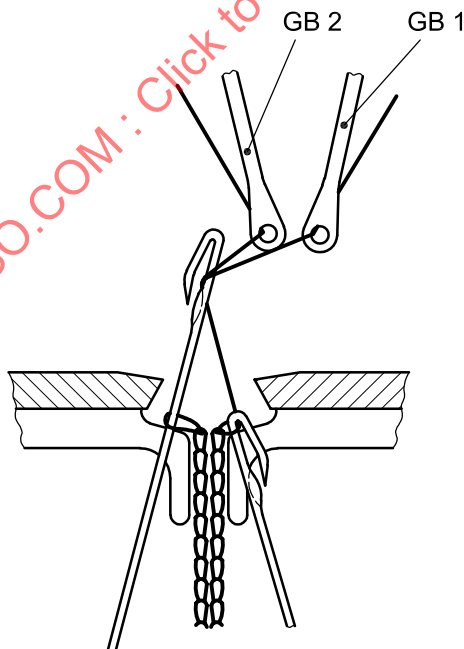


Figure 6 — RR (double) tricot machine with 2 ground guide bars (GB 1, GB 2)

Guide bar 1 (B 1) is the foremost positioned bar with yarn guides or yarn guide units (see Figure 6).

5.2.2 RR (double) Raschel machine

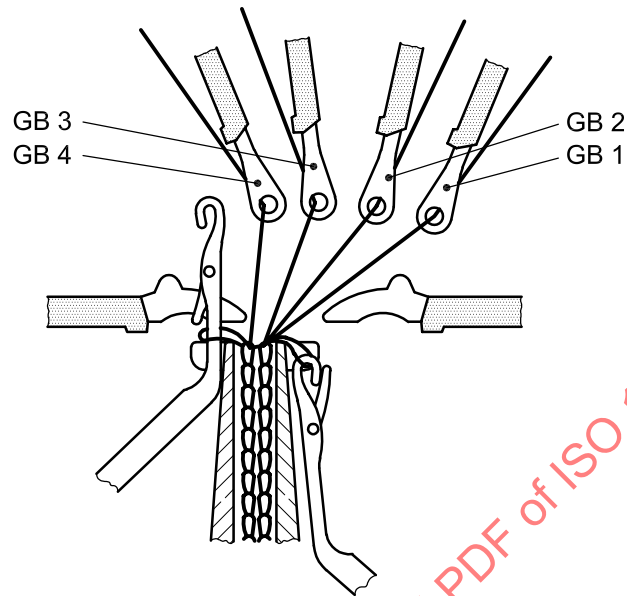


Figure 7 — RR (double) Raschel machine with 4 ground guide bars (GB 1 and GB 4)

Guide bar 1 (B 1) is the foremost positioned bar with yarn guides or yarn guide units (see Figure 7).
