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The committee responsible for this document is ISO/TC 61, *Plastics*, Subcommittee SC 1, *Terminology*.

Hexabromocyclododecane (HBCD) is now regulated as persistent organic pollutant (POP); thus, is excluded from codes 14 and 15 and is newly assigned to codes 23 and 24.

Silica is an inorganic compound and not an organic compound. "Silica compounds" is changed to "Silicon compounds".

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
