Foreword

1 Scope and field of application

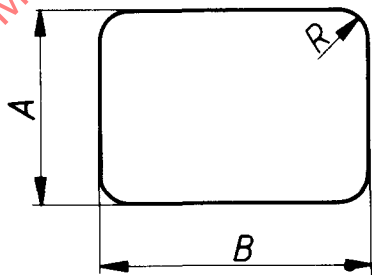
This International Standard specifies the image dimensions (on the film) of still pictures made with cameras in which the image dimensions are defined by the camera frame. This International Standard does not apply to panoramic or stereo photography cameras (see ISO 515).
