

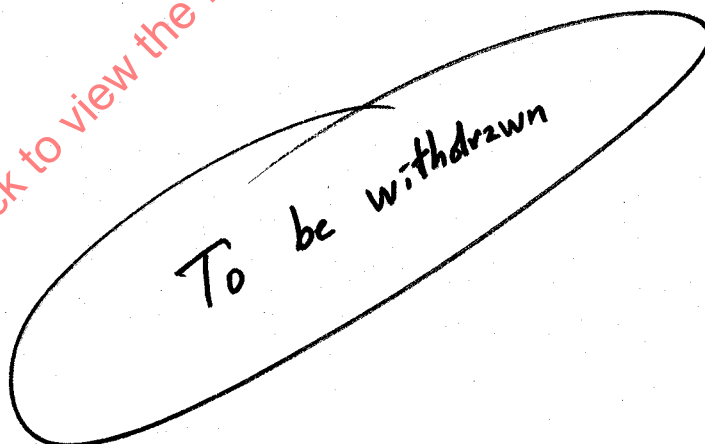

FOREWORD

Photography – Optical filters (mounted and unmounted) for photographic equipment – Dimensions and designations

1 SCOPE AND FIELD OF APPLICATION

This International Standard specifies the dimensions of photographic series filters, either mounted or unmounted. It is applicable to all types of filters, including glass (solid or laminated), plastic between glass, and gelatine wafer filters.

2 FILTER DIMENSIONS

The dimensions shall be as shown in the figure and table.

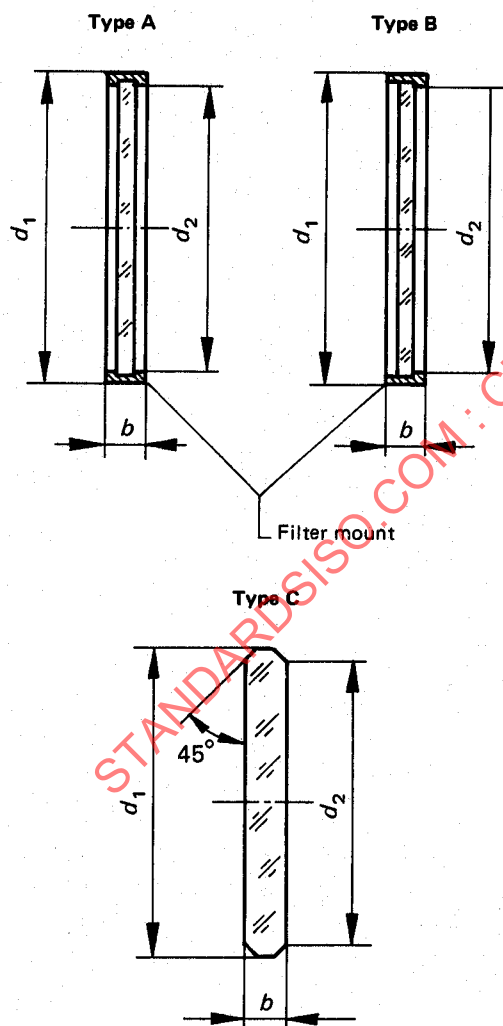
