Hazard Infection or contamination	
Human behaviour that is intended to be caused after understanding the safety sign's meaning Disinfecting hands	
Additional information Test data obtained according to ISO 9186-1 are not available. Consequently, a supplementary text sign shall be used to increase comprehension except when the safety sign is supplemented by manuals, instructions or training.
