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Add the following new term to Annex A:

A.14

side angle, en GB

angle of side, en GB

frame pantoscopic angle, en US

angle in the vertical plane, when the side is opened, between the perpendicular to a reference line touching the rear surface of the upper and lower rims along the vertical centreline and the line joining the middle of the joint to the point on the lower edge of the side that is assumed to make contact with the top of the ear

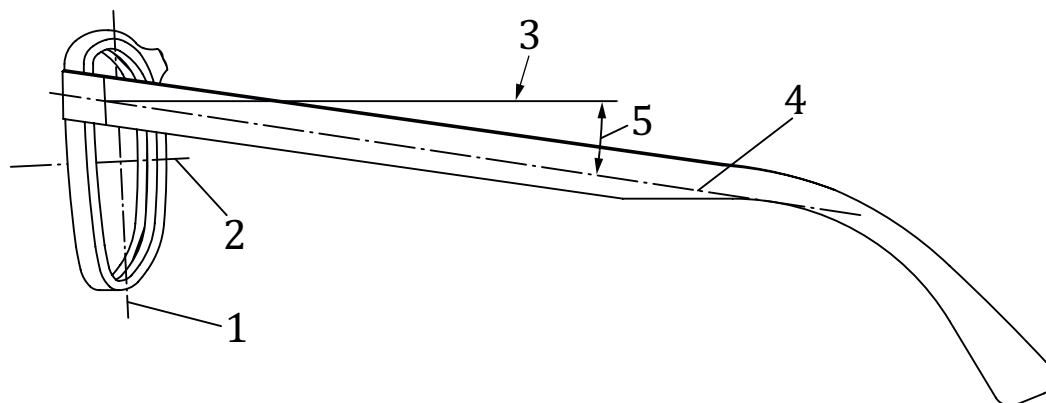
Note 1 to entry: See [Figure A.5](#).

Note 2 to entry: When the spectacle frame is of semi-rimless or rimless construction, the reference line should be taken as the line joining the rear surface of the upper and lower edges of a plano or demonstration or dummy lens along the vertical centreline.

Note 3 to entry: Unless otherwise stated, the side angle is regarded as positive if downwards from the perpendicular to the reference line.

Note 4 to entry: From ISO 7998, the following are the equivalent terms in other languages:

- French: angle d'inclinaison;
- German: Inklinationswinkel;
- Italian: inclinazione;
- Spanish: inclinación.
