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Amendment 1 to International Standard ISO 8925:1989 was prepared by Technical Committee ISO/TC 127, *Earth-moving machinery*.

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Page 1, 3.1

Replace subclause 3.1 with the following and delete the footnote at the bottom of page 1).

The port size for measuring temperature and pressure, and to obtain fluid samples shall be $M10 \times 1,25$, $M14 \times 1,5$, $M16 \times 1,5$ or PT 1/8. However, an $M14 \times 1,5$ port in accordance with ISO 6149 attached to a tube of 8 mm outside diameter shall be most preferable.

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
